- Who:** This competitive internship is intended for **undergraduate college students who are interested in a career in medicine and clinical research**. Twelve Interns will have the opportunity to:
- Assist an investigator on a clinical research project resulting in a poster presentation at the end of the eight-week program
  - “Shadow” physicians and clinical researchers
  - Learn many of the necessary skills for conducting clinical research.
  - Participate in medically-related cultural excursions
  - Interns will receive a \$1,500 award at the end of the eight-week program

**Where:** Eight Interns will be based at The Queen's Medical Center, and four Interns will be based at The Department of Native Hawaiian Health.

**When:** June 16-August 8, 2008
